

### The Destination

Overlooking the Indian Ocean, 74km south of Perth, Mandurah is a vibrant and diverse city in the heart of Western Australia's Peel Region. It has over 130 square kilometres of idyllic inland waterways.

Mandurah's new marina precinct promises cosmopolitan restaurants, cafes and markets on the newly developed Venetian canals; a variety of water based activities and cruises on the bay; and breathtaking views of the ocean stretching from pristine beaches. Beyond the city centre you will discover boutique wineries, B&Bs and historical sites.

From Perth, Mandurah is just 60 minutes by car and 48 minutes by train.

### Venue and Accommodation

Featured in the International Architecture Year Book No.5, the newly built Mandurah Performing Arts Centre boasts spectacular views of Mandjar Bay and is located in the heart of Mandurah's boardwalk and cultural precinct. Please read the entire document before completing the forms required. Then submit your abstract and abstract submission form.

**Abstracts should only be submitted with the understanding that the presenter will register for the full conference and submit payment of the subsidised speaker registration fee of \$695 by the early bird date of 1 July 2013. Max of two presenters per abstract may register at the subsidised fee.**

Abstracts may be submitted for consideration as an oral or poster presentation. Authors of accepted abstracts will be advised by 13 May 2013.
